PASTOR'S COLUMN

This Lenten season we will be exploring the most famous sermon of all time. Jesus gave it while sitting in a grass-sloped natural amphitheater overlooking the Sea of Galilee. It has been nicknamed the *Sermon on the Mount*. In it Jesus declares his authority and directly interprets the intention God had in giving the law to Moses and the people of Israel.

It begins with what we have called the Beatitudes, a list of *blessings*, *(makarios* in Gr.) which translates the Hebrew word *baruach*, and means "That which would make someone happy." Someone once said all people want to be happy, but in our culture that means "giddy with delight." In the Jewish culture it meant something much deeper. It meant "being exactly where you know you should be, having made the decisions and taken the actions that are true to yourself and the person you want to be." The one thing we must see is that the Beatitudes by which Jesus begins this sermon are not a mild and sentimental collection of platitudes.

We can see this by looking at them from their opposites. Some, Jesus implied, will not be blessed. Their condition could be described in this way:

Wretched are the spiritually self-sufficient, for theirs is the kingdom of hell.

Wretched are those who deny the tragedy of their sinfulness, for they will be troubled.

Wretched are the self-centered, for they will be empty.

Wretched are those who ceaselessly justify themselves, for their efforts will be in vain.

Wretched are the merciless, for no mercy will be shown to them.

Wretched are those with impure hearts, for they will not see God.

Wretched are those who reject peace, for they will earn the title "Sons of Satan."

Wretched are the uncommitted for convenience's sake, for their destination is hell.

The Beatitudes are a direct challenge to almost everything we assume about "the way things are" in the world. The only way they make sense is if Jesus Christ himself is able to sustain the blessings he pronounces. When that fact becomes our fact, and when we become convinced that Jesus Christ has the authority to support his promises, then the word *blessed* not only invites us to find the right path but also to welcome the path we find.

We now have the biblical doctrine of success. Success is not measured in possessions or by the state of our health. Success means to be where I am supposed to be -- the right place at the right time and for the right reason -- because of the purpose for my life that has its origins in God's love and faithfulness. If I am on the right road then I am successful in this radical rearrangement of our ordinary value systems. Success for those who believe this amazing Sermon on the Mount is a word about relationship with the Shepherd-Lord of the pathway and about our journey upon that pathway. Earl Palmer

To further enhance the dramatic effect of this opening salvo in this famous sermon, consider how J. B. Phillips, looks at the Beatitudes from the world's point of view in his book When God Was Man: Happy are the pushers, for they get on in the world. Happy are the hard-boiled, for they never let life hurt them. Happy are they who complain, for they get their own way in the end. Happy are the blasé, for they never worry over their sins. Happy are the slave drivers, for they get results. Happy are the knowledgeable men of the world, for they know their way around. Happy are the troublemakers, for they make people take notice of them.

This is one exciting, challenging, sermon!

Bean Counter's Corner

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D. James Kennedy was the senior pastor of Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauderdale, Florida from 1960 until his death in 2007; a church he founded. He also founded Knox Theological Seminary in 1989. He wrote almost 70 books. Every Fall he would have a "Stewardship Sunday" where he would preach about giving. Eight of those sermons comprise the book, Freedom From Financial Fear.

Three lessons can be taken away from these sermons:

- 1) You can't out give God:
- 2) Many people in our nation are fearful of the future but no matter how great that fear may be, hope should be greater;
- 3) God's promises never fail although some have conditions attached to them which we must fulfill in order to receive the benefits.

The first chapter in this book is called "On Giving and Receiving." Unfortunately, most people see giving as throwing money away but it is actually sowing. My husband, Jerry, came home a few years ago and told me he was getting a raise. His exact words to me were "Don't spend it all." What he actually meant was don't give it all away. I don't spend money, at least not all of it. I give money away. Because I give money away, we have been reaping the rewards. I don't worry about money and the future like he does. I know and trust God to take care of all of our needs.

The Scriptures tell us we should learn to develop a sense of altruism (a devotion to the welfare of others), give for the needs of others, and give out of love to God. God doesn't need our money. Money is nothing to God except an "index to our souls." How is your index? When making a decision about giving, one of the most important decisions of all, do you come in faith?

Many people may not realize it but they covet money. In our society it's all about "keeping up with the Joneses." Dr. Kennedy writes, "Covetousness is so insidious, so subtle, and so stealthy in the way it wraps itself around our hearts and souls and squeezes the love of God out of us that many people do not realize that it is there." The only antidote for covetousness is giving.

Many people in many churches have good intentions. They want the mission enterprise of the church to be extended, and want to reach out for Jesus. But when it comes to the hard decisions - making a pledge, making a commitment, and giving a gift, they fail. This may come, Dr. Kennedy states, from a combination of a failure in faith and love. Faith believes the promises of God and that God is concerned for us, and that we cannot out give God. A love for God is what motivates and drives us. We love because He loves us!

Not only are we busy with Family Promise and the Amor trip, but did you know that

your Mission Committee donates to charities around the world? One of these charities comes from our very own partnership with the Amor organization. Amor is currently running programs entitled **Project Hope: Clean Water for Life** and **Casa de Amor**. Our giving provides resources to help keep the ministry moving forward. Amor has built 415 homes for families who otherwise may never have owned a home, provided \$31,200 worth of food distributed



through 26 Mexican churches, gave-out 1,847 Bibles to churches and families within the communities, provided 2,560 backpacks to school children, 1,500 blankets for winter relief, and 12 water filters for families to provide clean, safe, and less expensive drinking water. Keep up the good work everyone and gentlemen, if you want to see these results first hand, come join us on our Men's Amor trip April 26th-29th, 2014.

PILLARS

"We called ourselves the 'Pioneers' said **Marilyn Chase** as she showed off a cherished old photo of church friends. There stand 16 people in two stiff rows, men and women in "church clothes," all looking vigorous - in their prime of life. "That's my husband Bob next to me there.... Oh, I don't know about that

mustache!" She pointed to each person and remembered his or her name, memories sweeping her expressive face. "These people are all gone now, except for me." Marilyn has a treasure trove of memories of the First Presbyterian Church of Newhall and she comes by it honestly. Though not nearly the oldest member of the church, she wins the trophy for longevity. She has been a faithful member for 57 years, longer than any other person. Though it's hard every Sunday Morning getting her disabled daughter Wendy Lee ready, she is determined to never miss church and you will see her and Lee there in the second service every week. Faith and church attendance have been her life and spiritual anchor since childhood.

Marilyn's early years were spent in Massachusetts. She had four siblings, one of whom was her identical twin sister Mary. Her mother insisted that the two of them dress identically at all times and they follow that tradition to this day. Mary lives in Missouri, but when they get together they dress alike from hat to shoes! ("That's Mary's idea," says Marilyn laughing.) You may have experienced a double-take when you saw them together on the church patio during one of Mary's visits here!



Marilyn's parents were adventurous and struck out for California in 1952. "I was a New Englander through and through, but I had no choice," she says. They made several moves around the San Fernando Valley, her parents both eventually finding good jobs at Lockheed. They moved to Newhall in 1955 on a Saturday. The next day they visited Newhall Presbyterian. (There were only two other churches back then, the Baptist and the Catholic.) They formally joined the church shortly thereafter. This photo was taken of Marilyn in 1956 at a Sunday School picnic. Bob was a young sailor returning from the Navy. Though he was raised in Newhall, he was out of the loop and asked a friend if there were any girls he could meet. His friend told him about a set of twins, but one was already engaged. "Well, how about the other one?" Bob asked. And the rest is history!

Bob's family owned acreage in lower Placerita Canyon, and the young couple built their home there, eventually accumulating a museum of antiques, old cars, mementos and memories. Marilyn, and her daughters Julie and Lee live there to this day.

From the time she married, Marilyn wanted to be a mother - that was her strongest calling in life, but she had to wait five years. Thinking they might be denied biological children, they adopted Julie - then as it often happens after adoption, she became pregnant and in quick succession along came Noel, Amy, and lastly her own set of twins, Wendy Lynn and Wendy Lee (Lynn and Lee). When her own children were still young, she and Bob began taking foster children. "I specialized in the 'D-Rate' children, the most troubled and difficult to place. I treated them just like my own, and except for one who was of a different religion, they all came to church. There were so many of them, usually girls, over a period of 30 years that I lost track of the numbers." Along with her large family, she relished all of the domestic skills, cooking, baking, gardening and sewing. She laughs about their Easter tradition. They all (including the foster kids and herself) would wear identical hand-made dresses, and often Bob had a tie to match. "Glenda Johnson used to stand out by the parking lot on Easter Morning to be the first to see our outfits!"

As for church activities, both Marilyn and Bob were Deacons, they both served as Church Treasurer for three years and they were Mariners. Marilyn and her three sisters sang in the choir. "Sometimes we *were* the choir." They were also members of the Centennial Committee in 1991. Bob's calling was to be an usher and he served faithfully in that capacity up until two weeks before he died in 2012.

As for the future, Marilyn prays for her good health to continue so that she can care for her dear Lee ("I promised Bob I would.") and attend church every Sunday. She is blessed that her daughters live in the area and she hopes to see her eight grandchildren grow up. "Oh, and wouldn't it be nice if we could honor the 'pioneers' still among us. There are quite a few of us who have been members of the church for 50 years or longer."




Church Life Sponsored Activities:
