PASTOR COLUMN MARCH 2016

What would you say to a friend of yours who was not a religious person, but asked you to define GRACE? Maybe that friend had heard you use the term a lot, and wondered what it meant to you. I can tell you why I hear myself reflectively using it all the time—I'm so in need of GRACE that it's always on my mind. For me GRACE is what moves me forward when I experience the shame of realizing my selfish or disappointing behavior. But GRACE is also what challenges me to behave better as I move forward in life.

Yet it is easy to forget that not all people experience the concept of GRACE in life. There are many people who long for something that they can't describe, but wish they could experience. Maybe that is because the Christian virtue of GRACE is displayed so rarely in our culture. Upon reflection, I'm embarrassed to admit to you how often I am unwilling to offer GRACE or incapable of doing so, and how demanding of it I am from others.

In the funny pages I came upon a Cartoon where Winthrop and his buddy are walking to school. Winthrop says: "My Mom made me broccoli sandwiches for lunch. Yesterday she made me liver sandwiches. She's still getting even with me for that lamp I broke." We can identify with that because, even though we know it's wrong, sometimes we try to get even. Sometimes we think that's the way God acts too. But the Good News is that God is filled with GRACE and merciful and forgiving.

I am convinced, though, that we will look back on 2016 and measure it largely through the lens of GRACE – and that our assessment of the year, looking back, will be based on how freely or reluctantly GRACE was distributed in our homes, workplaces, and worshipping communities, in our neighborhoods, on Facebook and in the voting booth.

As our society becomes more polarized, as differences between us are magnified, as political and theological turf is staked out, GRACE will be the gift that allows us to hold on to unity and peace, or its paucity will be at the root of our divisiveness and fear.

During this reflective season of Lent, let us consider carefully the importance of GRACE. The world at large may not know the word for unmerited favor, but it hungers for it nonetheless. After all, as Max Lucado is reminding us in our Lenten studies, "It's Not About Me."





Mechanical engineers from Newhall church travel to Laos to offer water filtration system to poor residents

Art Moore, 79, has gone on mission trips most of his life, inspired by his faith to help others that needed it most. He'd been to Mexico to build houses and Ecuador for a medical mission trip. So when his longtime friend Jack Irwin, 69, suggested they look into a mission trip to Laos with Living Waters for the World to install a water filtration system, Moore's interest was piqued.

Moore and Irwin have been mechanical engineers and Christians their entire lives. The two attend church at Presbyterian Church of Newhall. Building a water filtration system in a developing country appealed to both their professional talents and Christian beliefs to help others.

"It's a way of caring for people and letting them know Christ isn't something to be afraid of," Irwin said. "Jesus said, 'Care for the thirsty, poor and hungry.' We are just there to help and love them."

The two were sponsored by the Presbyterian Church of Newhall and connected to University Presbyterian Church in Fresno, which has gone on mission trips to Laos for 14 years with their group, called Lao Partners. Moore and Irwin attended training in Oakhurst,

meeting Lao Partners, which had been searching for more people to help with the missions to Laos.

"They told me they had been praying for more people to make the trip happen," Irwin said. "That's a God moment. He just put us together."

With three other people from Lao Partners, the team made one trip to Ecuador to survey a site for a similar system before they could be ready for the trip to Laos.

"It was not an easy system, but came relatively easy to us, considering our background," Moore said.

They went for 17 days last November, meeting representatives from both the People's Democratic Republic government and the Laotian Evangelical Church to guide, facilitate and translate. They visited seven villages to survey and troubleshoot systems but spent much of their time in Yod Kuea installing that system and training the local village, which had about 50 families.

"You go through culture shock; in every way it is different there," Irwin said. "This really isn't for everybody. You have to be ready to be immersed in their way of life which is completely different from America."

Revealing God through actions

The group faced many challenges and differences that would test them, such as language, food, customs and even having readily available clean water. They were told not to proselytize or share their faith in any verbal way. Despite the adversity, they felt the trip was rewarding and helped them fulfill their calling.


This is how I preach the gospel, by using my gifts as an engineer to help others," Moore said.

Irwin and Moore both noted the country's history with the U.S. has been difficult. They saw shell casings and craters from bombs and heard stories of people who lost family members from the bombing done during the Vietnam War, what Laotians call "The American War."

"I didn't realize how much damage we had done there," Moore said. "We made mistakes as a country, but our trip showed we are trying to meet some of their needs and we really do care; we want to give them clean water."

Even with the complicated history, the villagers welcomed the missionaries with open arms. Nearly everyone was grateful for the help the missionaries offered. The lieutenant governor of the Xiengkhuan province attended the closing ceremony and was pleased with the work the group did. The water system will offer each family in the village five gallons of clean water a day.

"We went to a strange country with a Buddhist culture, communistic type of government and spoke the gospel through what we did, not what we said," Irwin said.


FINDING GOD'S DIRECTION




