PULPIT POSITION TIHd-ed

As many of you know, when I came to the church, I was reintroduced to a younger man who was working with our youth, who happened to have been in my dorm when I first went to Whitworth. Paul Rock had recruited Phil Aijian to work overseeing our youth program. It didn't take long to recognize Phil's great love for people and caregiving. As we found an Associate Pastor, Phil was ready to "hang up" his youth work. But God had other plans. I asked Phil to take our Deacons (and later create Stephen's Ministry with the help of Sandy McIntosh.) He has a great sense of humor and a tremendous love of people.

Having grown up as a "PK" (preacher's kid) he was no stranger to church ministry. And although many PK's don't have great memories of church, Phil and his siblings were aware of the pitfalls of working at a church, yet still found themselves involved in communities of faith. His sister Rachael Durley married a Presbyterian minister and as a member of our family of faith has served in many leadership and caring positions in our church.

This led to Phil's wife Patti and me pushing him to complete his studies to become an ordained Certified Lay Pastor in our San Fernando Presbytery and serving on our pastoral staff here at First Pres. Newhall. The one thing Phil has resisted was any desire to preach in the pulpit. However, God has been working on his heart, during this painful time of closing his family's Door and Sash store in San Fernando Valley.

I am delighted to tell you that at our last Session meeting, the Elders of our church created a new calling for Phil to preach once a month at our church. He will begin this new assignment in November. In addition he has made himself available to preach "pulpit supply" for other churches in our Presbytery, as long as it doesn't compromise his commitment to our family of faith.

A story, of which you may not be aware, happened to Phil as he made a call at the home of one of our parishioners. He rang the doorbell and was waiting to be received but no one came to the door. He sensed that someone was at home but repeated ringing of the bell brought no response. As a final departing act he wrote Revelation 3:20 on the back of one of his calling cards and stuck it under the door: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone will hear my voice and open the door I will come in." Two days later Phil received his calling card back in an envelope with a brief note attached which simply contained the text from Genesis 3:10: "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself." (This story is apocryphal.)

After all, as the proverb goes, "When one door (shop) closes, the Lord "Phils" with another."

THE HOLY SPIRIT by Sonja Tweedie

On May 24th the Christian Church celebrated Pentecost. The choir robes were adorned with red stoles, our Pentecost banner was hung, and our sanctuary was decorated with red flames and flowers thanks to Tina Pulliam's amazing creativity.

Meanwhile the Friday Midday Bible Study spent May and June learning about the Hoy Spirit. We thirsted to learn more about Him, who He is, what He does, His language, how He speaks to us and what He can do through each of us.

Presbyterians and other reformed denominations rarely hear about the Holy Spirit in worship. We sing "Glory Be to the Father" and the Doxology both of which include the Holy Spirit; we baptize babies, children and adults in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; we recognize the Trinity, but in worship we generally hear more about Jesus and God. The Holy Spirit is mentioned at Pentecost, but rarely talked about at other times. In Acts 2 we observe the Apostles as the Holy Spirit descends on them and we see in the remainder of Acts how the Holy Spirit works through them, giving them strength, courage and abilities, without which there most likely would not have been the Christian Church.

In the book <u>Longing for God</u> by Richard Foster and Gayle Bebee which Bill mentioned in his Feb. 15th sermon and which many of us have read, Beebe states "We enter into a life with God, a conversational and redemptive relationship in which our life becomes open to the influence of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit initiates life within us and guides us in a never-ending process of being formed into the likeness of Christ."

In our baptism we were filled with the Holy Spirit, but it is up to us to acknowledge His presence within us and to realize that He is at the ready when we need Him. In Galatians 5:22,23 Paul shares that the Holy Spirit gives us nine Fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. We learn in Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12 and Ephesians 4 that we also receive Gifts of the Spirit, some of which include pastoring, teaching, leadership, healing, wisdom and miracles.

The Holy Spirit is the source of life from God. He is the one, through Christ, who connects us to God. He is our strength and comfort. We are to turn to Him when we are in trouble and when we are weak, being assured that He intercedes with and for us. The Holy Spirit will lead us and teach us.

People say if they need God's help they ask God or Christ, but scripture tells us that God, although omnipresent, is on His throne in Heaven and Christ is seated at God's right hand. Where is the Holy Spirit that we received during baptism? He is within us to help us and guide us throughout our lives.

This is where we get the strength and stamina to get through the tough times. He gives us creativity - Tina does not come up with those decoration ideas on her own and He assists Bill with his sermons and research. Many of us use Him everyday both for small tasks and for answers to difficult questions. It is amazing how much more we can accomplish. Life is so much easier when we recognize that power within us.

The Holy Spirit is in our worship services through the sermon, scripture and song. He gives us joy we might not think possible. Acknowledge the Holy Spirit within you and discover how glorious life can be.

THE ARK

Genesis 6: 11-22 ¹¹Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. ¹²God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. ¹³So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. ¹⁴So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. ¹⁵This is how you are to build it: The ark is to be three hundred cubits long, fifty cubits wide and thirty cubits high. ¹⁶Make a roof for it, leaving below the roof an opening one cubit high all around. Put a door in the side of the ark and make lower, middle and upper decks. ¹⁷I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. ¹⁸But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark–you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you. ¹⁹You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you. ²⁰Two of every kind of bird, of every kind of animal and of every kind of creature that moves along the ground will come to you to be kept alive. ²¹You are to take every kind of food that is to be eaten and store it away as food for you and for them."

In early 2015, Phil got a request by an elderly woman who was wheelchair-bound asking for help with her weed problem. The neighbors had been complaining about how overgrown the weeds had become and she really wanted to do something about it, but this lady did not have any resources or anyone who could help her. What was she to do? Maybe her church could help? Good idea! So she called up Phil and asked if he could help. Being the amazing guy Phil is, he contacted the Youth Team to see who could help this lady. The youth team got a few volunteers together and within a week they started the job. They went over to the woman's residence on three different occasions to help pull her weeds for hours at time. Even though the sun was beating the younglings down, they kept their heads up high and the sweat bonded them a little closer. Not only was the youth team able to help this member, but they were able to get stronger as a group.

Through this example, the Mission Committee has created an opportunity for people of all ages to participate in the ARK (Actions of Random Kindness). The ARK is a local mission opportunity where if someone is in dire need of assistance the ARK aims to help in the best way possible. If you want to help we will be more than happy to have you on board. We will be looking to take assignments as they come in and fulfill those requests depending on availability or skill set required.

After a nationwide search of adult Christian education programs our Adult Education Committee created our own model called "Life Academy." It is unique, not found in any of the other churches we surveyed. The news of our successful "model" has traveled around our San Fernando Presbytery and it has been copied by Granada Hills Presbyterian Church.

Your Participation has made Life Academy Successful!

Before Life Academy, First Pres had literally the same dozen or so people taking one adult course each fall, winter and spring. Now we have upwards of 65 people taking many courses each fall and spring.

Life Academy fits the Busy Lives of Today with Short Courses!

Instead of the 12 to 16 week adult education courses that are typically offered in churches, Life Academy courses may be only one class or at the most 7 class sessions in length.

Life Academy gives You a Window into the Wide World Around Us!

Courses have opened up your personal world to the local, national and global communities. We can indeed become "Global Christians." We have heard experts speak on Islam. Teachers talked about Christianity in Egypt, Pakistan and India. Scientists from "Reasons to Believe" presented intriguing information on science and faith. Mission leaders have shared from the SCV Homeless Shelter, Zoe's children's ministry in Thailand, and the Mary Magdalen Project in LA to rescue prostitutes. We have watched the fabulous pastor Rev. Nicky Gumble of England teach on the basics of Christian faith in "Alpha." We have heard experts on health, nutrition, finance, family issues and on social issues such as bullying and addiction.

Life Academy Gives you Excellent Bible Teaching and Instruction on the Christian Life!

We have toured the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation to learn and understand the Written Word of God. We have taught on Christian Disciplines: prayer, mediation, and listening to God. Courses have covered our Presbyterian heritage and traditions and the creeds and confessions that guide our church and our denomination PCUSA. We have also sat together to see movies on spiritual leaders such as CS Lewis, probably the most influential Christian writer and apologist of the 20th Century.

Life Academy Gives You an Opportunity to Share your Gifts, Talents and Knowledge!

We thank and honor many in our own congregation who have shared their expertise and knowledge. We count 42 people from our congregation who have taught in Life Academy since 2008, some multiple times. They have shared on a variety of subjects.

Why Should I Participate in Life Academy? The Bible tells us to study the Written Word of God

Paul, probably the greatest theologian in Christian history, wrote these instructions to his disciple Timothy: "...the Holy Scriptures ... are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. [For] all Scripture is God-breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man [and woman] of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3: 15-17) These are still excellent instructions for those who want to follow our Heavenly Father and His Son Jesus.

Why Should I Participate in Life Academy? Our Presbyterian Tradition Holds that Every Member Should be Informed and Educated.

Who can say he or she knows everything about the Faith? We are all on a "learning curve" to be more faithful. Education in our Presbyterian tradition is not just the domain of the Ordained Pastors. Elders and Deacons, as leaders of the Congregation, are to be knowledgeable. Members are to grow in understanding of the Christian Faith and of the Holy Scriptures, which guides us in the Christian life and through which God does speak to each of us. In addition, the Presbyterian tradition is NOT to cloister ourselves away from society as some traditions are apt to do, but to be involved as Christians in society, and to do so we must be knowledgeable and informed.


