

Types of Christian Service

Scholarships may be granted to assist in participation in any voluntary or Employed activity with an Organization that has a Christian Purpose.

- First Presbyterian Church of Newhall Youth Leader
- Christian Missions
- Working at a Christian Conference Center or a Church camp
- Attending a conference Sponsored by a Christian Organization
- Volunteering with the VIM (Volunteers in Mission) Program of the PCUSA Denomination

Scholarship money may be disbursed directly to the recipient or to the Christian Service organization.

The scholarship applicants shall demonstrate financial need, and will be expected to contribute to the endeavor so that the scholarship shall not fund the entire financial need.

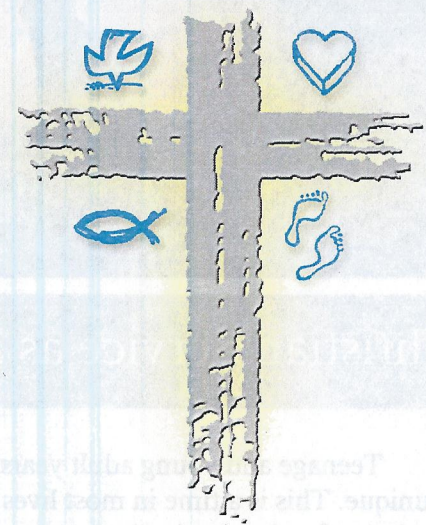

Recipients of the Scholarships

Eligible Applicants:

Youth and young adults of high school age and above who participate in the First Presbyterian Church of Newhall are eligible for these scholarships. Recipients shall apply to and be interviewed by the Youth Committee. The Youth Committee shall have the responsibility to select recipients and to award scholarships.

Christian Service as an Appeal to the Next Generation

Teenage and young adult years are unique. This is a time in most lives of relative freedom and a time to experiment. Especially, for those involved in the Christian Church, these years present an opportunity to engage in Christian Service, which may not be easily possible in later years in one's life when young adults start choosing commitments such as marriage, vocations, family, and children. These young years are also a time of great energy and enthusiasm, which could be directed in the service of Christ. The Youth Mission Trips are an example of this. Opportunities seized in these years can influence the life of a Christian youth for the rest of his or her life. In addition, experiences in Christian Service may train a person for service

to Christ and may influence one's own decisions as to vocation, whether in service of the Christian Church or other avenues, and as to participation in the Christian Church. The Christian Church should always be encouraging youth and young adults to consider Christian vocations, and in fact, we at First Pres have some young adults from our congregation who are serving Christ in Christian vocations. Christian Service can also fulfill the interests and concerns of younger generations, who have eschewed the "traditional" Christian church and are more interested in "doing" the Gospel than in merely "hearing" the Gospel of Christ.
