February is actually a month that is full of shifts and changes. It begins with Superbowl Sunday on February 4, then proceeds through the month with the voting and preparing for the Academy Awards, finally celebrated on March 4. This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14, which is also Valentine's Day. In addition (if you are interested), Presidents' Day is celebrated on February 19, Chinese New Year is celebrated on February 16, and Purim begins at sundown on February 28.

February is a busy month. It is also, for many people, the coldest winter month. Maybe people keep busy because they need distraction from this bleak winter month? Maybe, in preparation for Spring, we take time to walk the Lenten road with our Lord preparing ourselves for our Easter celebration on April 1?

Yes, in the center of the month, on February 14, we begin our Lenten fasts and pilgrimages again to prepare ourselves for the Greatest Event in Human History. Contrary to popular culture, this is not the Superbowl or Valentine's Day, rather it is the resurrection of Jesus as the only begotten Son of the Father. This year during Lent we will observe and contemplate actors in the original story. In worship we will see characters "under the cross" as they reflect on their observations of this inglorious event. Many of you will join a weekly Bible Study to further reflect on these characters and events.

Maybe it's not so strange that Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day share the same date. As Frederick Buechner put it so well: *"Romantic love is blind to everything except what is lovable and lovely. But Christ's love sees us with terrible clarity and sees us whole. Christ's love so wishes our joy that it is ruthless against everything in us that diminishes our joy. The worst sentence love can pass is that we behold the suffering which love has endured for our sake and that is also our acquittal. The justice and mercy of the judge are ultimately one."*

As we enter into the observation of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14, with our Ash Wednesday Worship service at 7 pm, we will be reminding ourselves that great love of Christ who redeems and directs our very lives.

I BID FAREWELL TO AN AMAZING COMMITTEE by Sonja Tweedie



PER CAPITA????? By Dorothy Ng, Church Treasurer

If you have ever looked near the upper left-hand corner on the back of the weekly bulletin, you saw a little message about per capita. This year it says that the 2018 per capita is \$38.00. You may have asked yourself, "What is per capita?" Well, I will answer that question for you.

The dictionary definition will tell you that it is a Latin prepositional phrase which means "for each head" or "by the head." It is commonly used in statistics, economics, and business to report some kind of average per person.

The official definition of per capita for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), as found on its website, is the following:

Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the mid councils to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians.

In other words, per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Every Presbyterian shares in the PC(USA)'s system of government, so every Presbyterian is asked to share in the coordinating and performing of the functions of that system. Per capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together.

Congregations, through their sessions, pay an annual amount of money per church member which is called the per capita apportionment, to their presbyteries. The annual amount is a combined request from the congregation's presbytery, synod, and the General Assembly based their respective budgets for the coming year.

In 2018 the Per Capita Apportionment is \$38.00 per member. This is broken down into three components:


General Assembly	\$ 7.73
Synod of Southern CA & Hawaii	\$ 2.85
Presbytery of San Fernando	\$ 27.42

This amount is multiplied by our church's reported membership for the year 2016, which was 329. That means the church owes the Presbytery of San Fernando \$12,502. Don't worry. We don't pay the amount all at once. I make 3 payment over the year. And each year it is a line item expense in the annual budget so the session makes sure the money is there to pay. However, it takes money away from other church projects.

So if you are a member who can do so, please consider reimbursing the church the \$38.00. And if you are not a member but you attend the church on a regular basis, maybe you could contribute the money for someone who cannot. If you have already given your \$38 for this year, I say thank you. If you have not, please pray about it. Your \$38 contribution might just help keep the air conditioning going through the summer.



With A Smile



WHY I LOVE LENT BUT DON'T PARTICIPATE IN LENTEN DISCIPLINES by Roland Wrinkle



We just took down our Christmas decorations. So, naturally, it's time to write about Lent. Lent isn't in the Bible. Rather, it's a tradition that got started nearly four centuries after Christ and never really took a foothold in the Protestant churches. But our congregation takes a pretty good go at it each year and I think that's a very good thing. The idea is to formalize our anticipation of the crucifixion and resurrection of the Messiah of Israel as the embodiment of the creator God, through disciplines and practices of self-examination and penitence, demonstrated by self-denial, such as giving up something you ordinarily wouldn't want to go without. *"By this small gesture of sacrifice, I remind myself of the ultimate sacrifice Jesus made on my behalf."*

Moreover, Lent occupies the 40 days before the bodily resurrection of the executed son of God—and 40 days, in the Bible, is a really big deal: In Genesis, the flood which destroyed the earth was brought about by 40 days and nights of rain. The Hebrews spent 40 years in the wilderness before reaching the land promised to them by God. Moses fasted for 40 days before receiving the ten commandments on Mount Sinai. Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness in preparation for his ministry. These are all critical markers of our own discipleship to the one who is the centerpiece of all of these stories.

More importantly, Lent is a sign pointing to the actual, historical and very real bodily resurrection of the Word-of-God-Embodied-As-Jesus the Messiah. And this is a big deal because Paul says that the resurrection of Jesus is the *"first fruits of those who have died...the resurrection of the dead has come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ"* and then adds that this is the foundation upon which all of our Christian faith and hope depends. So, Lent is an advent, an anticipation. In the same way we celebrate Advent Season, eagerly awaiting the anniversary, as it were, of God's decisive move to become human for the singular purpose of ensuring the success of His Grand Rescue Operation, we also observe the Lenten Season in anticipation of a much more important anniversary, i.e. God's decision to sacrifice that very Son through and in whom God Himself became vulnerable flesh and blood. However, as I understand things, there is a Third Advent. Every moment of every day we stand in glorious yet watchful anticipation of the Second Coming of Jesus to finish what He began on the cross, when Heaven comes down to and merges with earth, when there will be no more suffering, death will be abolished and God will, once again, walk among His People.

Now, back to this Lenten Advent, our church does a great job of expressing this 40-day focus on the resurrection by launching a whole bunch of Lenten Study Groups, with Bill and Phil preaching on a popular book we can all read and discuss. This entrenches us in the very Bible that has been gifted to us by God as the revelation of His own thoughts and plans. Many permanent Bible study groups and Bible studiers and leaders have grown out of these Lenten Study Groups. We then continue to read, study, think about and discuss the Bible until, well...we suffer bodily death.

Now, back to my Lenten non-practices. My friend is very serious about giving up certain pleasures/vices for Lent. I'm not. I'll tell you why. As a matter of personal judgment only, I am concerned about the *"Separation of Church and Life."* Since coming late to Bible fidelity, I slowly came to realize that, if all this stuff is actually true, then I've got to change—and change big time. Not change from a child molester or unscrupulous business man to a pious saint. But from one who saw the world through eyes of the Enlightenment and provable scientific truths to the better and more sure truths of the Bible which encompass, not just evolution, wave theory, the three laws of planetary motion and Newtonian physics (all of which I certainly buy), but those realities, certainties and historical discoveries which illuminate the grand narrative of God's program to rescue and redeem, not just me, but all of Creation and all of those who chose to become His children.

It's just that I don't want to leave the Bible, Jesus, God, New Creation, God's plan for us and the meaning of all of it at church on Sunday. I don't want to go five minutes without putting whatever I am doing into the larger context of what I understand from scripture or whatever I am thinking into how I and we fit into this plan. Where are we? What time is it? What does God want of me right now. Big things and small things. Big thoughts and mundane thoughts. This big story is going somewhere and I want to be where I am supposed to be and know as much as I can about what is going on in the now and yet-to-be Kingdom of God. I am afraid that, if I devote a particular 40-day period to this endeavor, it will become somewhat and somehow lessened the other 325 days of the year. If I promise to love my wife for 40 days each year, good luck the other 14,300 days we've been married so far.

Paul said, "*Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.*" The apparently rather devout "rich young ruler" asked Jesus what would it take to be a part of the *age to come* (*zoe aionios* means just this, not "eternal life") when God would fully establish His Kingdom here on earth. Keep all the laws of Torah? He did that. Love his neighbor as himself? He did that as well. Observe all the festivals and keep the Sabbath and visit the temple as prescribed by scripture? Yep, check that. But Jesus said that wasn't enough. He had to undergo a much more **radical change**. If I let this thoroughly distinctive (peculiar?) worldview slip away for too long a period of time, I worry that my Bible life will become more like the study of Einstein's Theory of Relativity and something less than the Living Word of God which is intended to inform everything I do and think every day of the year and saturate me with the person of Jesus and His holy intentions each waking minute. I am acutely aware of my deficiencies in this regard and, therefore, fear that devoting myself to such concerns for a specially-carved out period of 40 days will encourage me (give permission) to backslide the rest of the year. Once I take down the Christmas lights, I don't think about them much until the next year. But that's just me.
